**Seeks Senior Psychologist with expertise in trauma-informed psychotherapy**

Columbia Health is among the nation's largest and most comprehensive student health programs. Our Counseling and Psychological Services (CPS), staffed by more than 50 Psychologists, Psychiatrists, Social Workers, Postdoctoral Fellows, and Psychiatric Residents, is seeking a highly experienced licensed psychologist to provide direct clinical services, including crisis intervention, diagnostic assessment, and brief psychotherapy, to our diverse student population, with special emphasis on trauma survivors. The incumbent will co-facilitate a Trauma Support Team; develop and implement psychoeducational programs and therapy groups for trauma survivors; work closely with Columbia's Sexual Violence Response program; provide training and supervision to junior staff, postdoctoral fellows and/or psychiatric residents; manage emergent situations with at-risk students either directly or by providing consultation and support to junior staff treating such students; and participate, as needed, in Columbia Health or University committees and initiatives, among other specialized activities.

The position offers an opportunity to work in the stimulating and dynamic academic environment of a leading research university as well as significant professional development opportunities, including in-service programs, support for conference attendance, and ongoing peer supervision with a highly skilled group of clinicians working from multiple theoretical perspectives.

**Requirements:**

Ph.D. or Psy.D. in clinical psychology or Ph. D in counseling psychology; New York State license or eligible. Strong clinical, diagnostic, interpersonal, and collaborative skills. Multicultural competence. Demonstrated experience in the assessment and management of suicidality and crisis intervention and in trauma-informed treatment. Passion for, and experience in, working with trauma survivors. Some evening hours required. Minimum of 8 years' related experience with at least 5 years supervisory experience. Experience in college counseling is highly desirable.

Preference will be given to candidates with demonstrable experience and expertise in working with one or more of the following populations:

- Students of color
- First generation students
- International students
- LGBTQ populations
