Reporting to the Executive Director of SHACC, the Assistant Director of SHACC for Counseling Internship Education and Training will perform a range of activities servicing a diverse student community, including individual and group counseling, psychological assessment and crisis consultation. The Assistant Director shares responsibility for the oversight of psychology training programs, including the APA-Accredited internship and psychology externship training program. The ability to provide treatment and conceptualize services as well as provide training from a short-term cognitive-behavioral perspective is required.

Candidate will have strong quantitative and analytical skills and comfort with appropriate technologies including social media.
