

Staff Psychologist/Outreach Coordinator

The Division of Enrollment Management & Student Affairs at Roosevelt University invites applications for the **Staff Psychologist/Outreach Coordinator of the Counseling Center.**

Position Responsibilities: Reporting to the Director of the Counseling Center, the Staff Psychologist/Outreach Coordinator provides the overall management and leadership of the Wellness and Outreach program for the Chicago and Schaumburg campuses. The Staff Psychologist/Outreach Coordinator will establish and maintain collaborative relationships across the university through involvement in meetings and committees. The Staff Psychologist/Outreach Coordinator will manage the Peer Advocate program through supervision of the student advocates in their wellness initiatives. Staff Psychologist/Outreach Coordinator will oversee the Counseling Center internet and printed marketing materials. In addition to the administrative roles outlined above, the Staff Psychologist/Outreach Coordinator is a licensed clinical psychologist who fulfills the broad range of staff psychologist roles in the Counseling Center which include providing clinical and consultative services; delivering wellness/outreach programming; and providing training and clinical supervision to pre- and post- doctoral psychology trainees.

About Roosevelt University: Roosevelt University is nationally recognized for providing transformational experiences and opportunities for discovery that create socially conscious citizens who are leaders in their professions and their communities. Founded in 1945 on the principle that higher education should be available to all academically qualified students regardless of class, racial or ethnic origin, gender, or age, Roosevelt University is an independent, non-profit university that today enrolls close to 5,000 students and is among the most diverse institutions of higher education in the country. Minimum Requirements: The successful candidate must possess a doctorate degree in Clinical or Counseling Psychology. Experience in a university counseling center in areas such as clinical assessment, therapy, crisis management, training, supervision and mentoring, consultation, and administration and management of program development is preferred. Active licensure in the State of Illinois within six (6) months of hire is required. Strong organizational skills and exceptional interpersonal, verbal and written communication skills are needed. Experience in an urban college or university with a residential and large commuter student population is preferred.
