The Counseling Center at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte is seeking applicants for a 12-month, full-time postdoctoral fellowship to begin in early August, 2017. This fellowship is designed to offer advanced training in individual and group therapy, outreach, and consultation and includes a special emphasis on training and supervision.

The postdoctoral fellowship is designed for an individual who is seeking licensure and is interested in advanced training in a university counseling center. The primary responsibilities of the Fellow include individual, group, and couples therapy, intake interviews, crisis intervention, and outreach and consultation to students, faculty, and staff. Fellows also gain specialized experience and training in the provision of supervision and will be responsible for providing individual supervision to our first-year practicum students. Our fellows also enhance their skills in training through leading the beginning practicum training seminar and serving as a member of our Training Committee. Fellows receive weekly clinical supervision as well as supervision of their supervision of first-year practicum students.

Required qualifications include an earned doctorate in counseling or clinical psychology from an APA-accredited program, completion of an APA-accredited internship prior to the fellowship start date, and experience providing clinical supervision. A successful candidate will demonstrate strong skills as a clinician within a brief therapy model, clinical experience with young adults, demonstrated competency serving a diverse client population, and interest in training and supervision. Preference will be given to candidates with clinical experience in a college or university counseling center and experience providing clinical supervision.

The UNC Charlotte Counseling Center is IACS-accredited, and the doctoral internship program in Health Service Psychology is APA-accredited. UNC Charlotte is North Carolina's urban research university. Located in the state's largest metropolitan area, UNC Charlotte is among the fastest growing universities in the UNC System. The University comprises seven professional colleges and currently offers over 20 doctoral programs, 66 master's degree programs and 90 bachelor's degrees. More than 900 full-time faculty comprise the University's academic departments and the 2014 fall enrollment exceeded 27,000 students. UNC Charlotte boasts more than 100,000 living alumni and adds 4,000 to 4,500 new alumni each year.

Charlotte is the nation's 17th largest city and a growing cosmopolitan center. The surrounding 13-county metropolitan region includes 2.3 million people and offers easy access to the Blue Ridge Mountains and Atlantic beaches.

Salary is \$47,476 for the 2017-2018 year. Benefits include medical coverage, university holidays, and compensatory time off.
