



**PSYCHOLOGISTS:** The Counseling Center at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte is seeking qualified applicants for two full-time positions for Psychologists to begin on or around August 1, 2017. These are new positions serving a growing and dynamic student body. Responsibilities include individual and group therapy; consultation with faculty, staff, students, and others; outreach programming; psychological assessment; and supervision of graduate students. Selected candidates will be required to have the following by the beginning of employment: an earned doctoral degree in psychology; completion of an APA-accredited doctoral internship; eligibility for licensure as a psychologist in North Carolina; strong counseling skills within a brief model; clinical experience with diverse populations; enthusiasm for collaboration within the Center and throughout the University community; and demonstrated interest in university counseling. Preferred qualifications include experience providing services to special populations (e.g., students of color, men, international students, LGBTQ-identified students). Salary and benefits are competitive. The UNC Charlotte Counseling Center is IACS-accredited and is an APA-accredited pre-doctoral internship site.

The UNC Charlotte Counseling Center is a vibrant workplace, providing individual, group, and outreach services to a highly diverse student body and significant consultation services to the community. The Center offers training to beginning and advanced practicum students in psychology, counseling, and social work, to students in our APA-accredited doctoral program, and to a postdoctoral resident. The Center will be moving into a newly-constructed, free-standing facility in the fall of 2017.
