



LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER: The Center for Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS) at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte is seeking qualified applicants to fill a full-time position for a Licensed Clinical Social Worker to begin on or around August 1, 2019. Responsibilities include individual and group therapy; consultation with faculty, staff, students, and others; outreach programming; assistance with referral coordination; and supervision of graduate students, including interns from the University's MSW program. Selected candidates will be required to have the following by the beginning of employment: an earned Master of Social Work degree; completion of all supervision hours required to meet the criteria for a full license as a social worker in North Carolina; strong counseling skills within a brief model; clinical experience with young adults from diverse populations; and enthusiasm for collaboration within the Center and throughout the University community. Applications from disciplines other than Social Work and from applicants who will not be fully licensed as social workers by the start date will not be considered. Experience providing services to special populations (e.g., students of color, men, international students, LGBTQ-identified students, students with spectrum disorders) is preferred. Salary and benefits are competitive. CAPS is IACS-accredited and is an APA-accredited doctoral internship site.

CAPS is a vibrant workplace, providing individual, group, and outreach services to a highly diverse student body and consultation services to the community. The Center offers training to beginning and advanced practicum students in psychology, counseling, and social work, to students in our APA-accredited doctoral internship program, and to a postdoctoral resident. The Center is located in the Price Center, a free-standing state-of-the-art facility that opened in the fall of 2017.
