Position Description:

The Counseling Center Staff Therapist is an 11 month full-time position that provides mental health and wellness services for the student population at Syracuse University. Specifically, the staff therapist is responsible for the provision of short-term individual therapy, group therapy, crisis intervention, walk-in services, consultation, supervision of graduate student trainees, educational/preventative outreach programming, and participation in the Center's on-call rotation. As part of the Barnes Center, counseling is an integrated service with colleagues in health, recreation, and health promotion. Counseling Center staff take a holistic approach to supporting students and are expected to be active members of the university community, represent the Counseling Center on a variety of committees, and collaborate with colleagues across the university to promote student well-being and success.

Staff therapists must demonstrate high levels of cultural competency, be well versed at working with students from a variety of traditionally underserved and/or underrepresented backgrounds, and demonstrate an understanding of, and commitment to, social justice work. All staff therapists lead one or more therapy groups.

Minimum Requirements:

- Master's degree, or higher, in a mental health discipline (e.g., clinical or counseling psychology, social work, marriage and family therapy, or counselor education).
- Ph.D. or Psy.D. in psychology preferred.
- Must be licensed or licensed eligible within the state of New York within one year of employment.

Desired Qualifications:

- Experience providing clinical services to culturally diverse client population required.
- Experience with crisis intervention and the ability to conduct risk assessments and manage potentially high risk clients required.

- Experience providing group therapy required.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills required.
- Excellent time management skills.
- Ability to work collaboratively and creatively in developing outreach education programming.
- Experience working with college students preferred but not required
